

Wildlife, Waterfalls & Mountains



Tell Tale Travel has created this 15-day itinerary in Thailand as a private tropical cultural/nature adventure. This holiday is packed full of experiences - from bathing elephants and swimming in waterfalls to watching millions of bats swarm into the night, you will certainly return with memories to cherish for years to come. You'll trek up a mountain, feast on delicious Thai food, shop at markets and meet real local people whom you will consider your friends by the time you get home.

This is a private tour and can be taken at your own pace. The itinerary can also be customised to suit you perfectly (subject to availability). Beach extensions are also possible.



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Day 1 - Saturday

Fly overnight from London Heathrow to Bangkok on a direct flight with Thai Airways or Eva Air. *It is possible to fly from regional airports, contact us for more details. It is also possible to book this trip without flights.*

Day 2 – Sunday

Welcome to Thailand! One of our drivers will meet you, just look out for a sign with the Tell Tale Travel ‘peacock’! He will whisk you away to your charming boutique hotel, set in the charm of Bangkok’s days of oriental renaissance. Set away from the main tourist area, in the older part of Bangkok, this will be your welcome oasis from the hustle and bustle of the city. You’ll enjoy the thoughtful touches in your room and the personal attention you will receive from the friendly staff and the owner.



You will have a little time to relax and look at our maps and tips to make the most of Bangkok. Later, your driver will be back to take you through the city lit up by night to have dinner at an idyllic restaurant, a favourite with members of both the Thai and British royal families, located on the bank of the Chao Praya river which runs through the city.

Day 3 – Monday



This morning, you will be picked up by our guide, Tong, who will take you to the main sites of the Grand Palace, the Temple of the Emerald Buddha, Wat Pho, the oldest temple in Bangkok and Wat Arun (Temple of Dawn). This day, whilst a bit ‘touristy’ by Tell Tale Travel standards, will let you ‘tick off’ the main sights in Thailand, though you will also get a flavour of local life by taking in a local market and using public transport such as riverboat taxis.

You’ll be dropped at your hotel at around 4pm, which will give you some time to rest or relax. Later, your driver will pick you up and take you out in the city for the evening, have a look at our tips in your Tell Tale guest pack to choose where to eat, from charming restaurants set in peaceful gardens to the hustle and bustle of Chinatown or a glitzy rooftop restaurant, perched high on the city’s sky line, you’ll find something to suit you perfectly.

Day 4 – Tuesday

Time to get away from the big city!

First, a short flight to Chiang Mai, which will act as your gateway to the north of Thailand, the old ‘Lanna’ kingdom, rich in culture and nature with beautiful diverse landscapes from rolling hills and valleys to jungle and waterfalls. You will be picked up at the airport by one of our drivers who will take you to a residential area, Mae Rim in the Mae Sa valley, an ideal base to enjoy the nature, waterfalls and wildlife of the area, while still being close to the city of Chiang Mai. Here,



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you'll be guests of Mae, her husband Por, their son Art and family. After settling into the top floor of the house which you will have to yourselves, you will have an afternoon tour of the local area, including the local school and market. This evening, you will have a home-cooked dinner with the family - it will certainly be one of the culinary highlights of your holiday.

Day 5 – Wednesday

This morning, your driver will pick you up and take you to nearby Mae Sa Waterfalls. On the way, you will stop at an orchid farm, also home to butterflies who fly freely. When you get to the waterfalls, take your time to walk up the winding path around the 10 tiers of cascading waterfalls, there are plenty of spots to have your picnic lunch under the gigantic trees. The surrounding wilderness is full of tropical wildlife, especially birds. The songbirds and the butterflies flitting in and out of the trees are certainly beautiful.



This evening, your driver will be back to take you into Chiang Mai to visit the city by night. You can visit the famous night bazaar (although bear in mind it's a touristy market not a local one), or just have dinner at one of the many excellent restaurants the city has to offer, you can look at the map and tips in your Tell Tale guest pack.

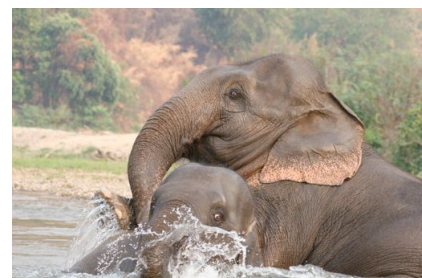
Days 6 and 7 – Thursday and Friday

These two days will certainly give you memories of which you will probably cherish forever.



Thailand is famous for its elephants and the country has many 'camps' where elephants are used for rides or 'circus tricks'. No risk of that with Tell Tale Travel, not only will your day will be a completely different from the average tourist experience, you will escape any places which mistreat these magnificent creatures. You will visit Elephant Nature Park, a sanctuary for elephants, many of whom have previously been ill-treated, but now have a home here.

When you get to the sanctuary, you'll meet the conservation staff and have an introduction to elephants in Thailand and the problems they face, as well as the work the foundation behind the sanctuary is undertaking to improve their lives both at the park and the wider world. Then it's time to meet the elephants and learn from their 'mahouts' who communicate and care for them in a deeply personal way. You'll get up close to the elephants and after some training, scrub them down in the river!



The next morning, you'll start with a walk to see the elephants wandering freely in the forest, before another day caring for them. *Please note these two days are a 'join-in' experience with other people. Also note, although these are 'domesticated' elephants, they are sensitive and contact will be within the parameters of meeting an animal the size of an elephant for the first time! Accommodation at the park is rustic, although you*

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will have private facilities and only need to take an overnight bag. Please note that depending on the number of visitors at the time of your trip, we sometimes use another smaller elephant sanctuary we work with.

Day 8 – Saturday



This morning, your driver will pick you up and take you into the historic city of Chiang Mai for some sightseeing. Part of the original layout of the city can still be seen today in the walls and moat. The river, which was once a considerable distance away, now flows through the centre. You can visit a selection of the many wats (temples) and religious sanctuaries before you visit handicraft villages in the outskirts of the modern city.

This evening, you will have an informal demonstration/lesson in Thai cookery at the house before dinner.

Day 9 – Sunday

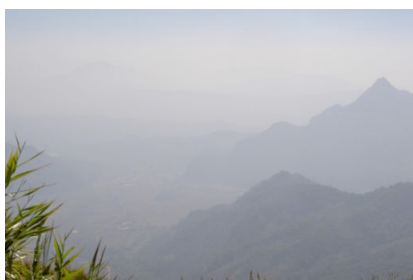
This morning, it's time to pack up and say goodbye to your new friends, Mae and her family. Whilst the drive north will take around four hours, you can sit back and enjoy the fabulous panoramic views. You will arrive in a breathtaking valley surrounded by high mountains, geographically situated by Thailand's northern border with Laos.

First, it's time for lunch on the terrace with your host Yui (a former trekking guide) who moved back to his home village and has made an idyllic home and adopted many animals. Relax on the verandah after lunch, enjoying the tranquil setting before settling into your simple but charming chalet in the grounds.



Later, you will have a tour of the local area with Yui. You will see local people fishing in traditional ways, weaving baskets and farming and harvesting crops from tropical fruit trees to shallots. You could join in one evening with the local villagers to play football and *Sepak Takraw*, an imaginative Thai sport similar to volleyball, except that it uses a rattan ball,

Day 10 – Monday



Today, Yui will take you trekking, across the rice fields and into the neighbouring mountains. There are no trails here so you'll certainly enjoy discovering real nature along the way. Once you reach the top, you can admire panoramic vistas of both beautiful untouched Thailand and neighbouring Laos. You'll have a barbeque lunch today – you'll have to build your own fire to cook your food. *This day can be set completely to your own sense of adventure and comfort level.*

When you get back, enjoy some well-deserved pampering with a traditional Thai massage. You'll have dinner under a blanket of sparkling stars.

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Day 11 - Tuesday

Today, you will visit a Hmong village where you will visit the school and meet the children, then you will spend the day visiting lovely waterfalls nearby which are perfect for swimming. After a picnic lunch, you can have a walk or simply lie back and relax with a book.

This evening, you will venture to a freshwater prawn farm – you can learn how the prawns are reared before you have your delicious dinner. *Vegetarians and those who don't like prawns can be catered for.*

Day 12 - Wednesday

Time to move on for the next part of your trip. This morning, you will be driven to Chiang Rai airport from where you will take a short flight to Bangkok. Then it's a few hours drive to Khao Yai National Park, Thailand's oldest national park and a UNESCO World Heritage Site, where you will arrive at a lodge.

Although you will spend most of the day travelling, you should have a little bit of time to relax and settle in. This evening, you'll be taken to the local village of Pak Chong where you can visit the night market. This is a genuine market for locals, not tourists and is a great place to see the locals of the Isan region and have an authentic dinner from a food stall (though not great for shopping opportunities!).

Day 13 - Thursday

Today, you'll have most of the day free to relax from your adventures so far. You can enjoy the swimming pool at the lodge or relax in the beautiful gardens.



This evening, it's time to head into Khao Yai National Park - spanning an area of over 2,000 square kilometers, this UNESCO World Heritage Site has a wide range of altitudes going up to 1000m above sea level and a range of terrains from mountains to tropical jungle. Khao Yai contains over 67 types of mammals, 320 types of birds and 3,000 species of plants. You will drive up to the Bat Cave just in time to see over millions of bats swarm out for the night.

Day 14 - Friday

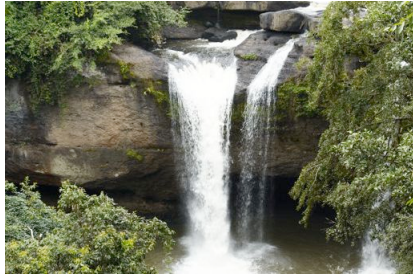
An early start this morning, you'll arrive at Khao Yai at 7am when the animals are active. Khao Yai is home to much tropical birdlife and wildlife such as deer, gibbons, elephants and clouded leopards. There are supposedly still tigers here, although it's highly unlikely you will see one! You'll start the morning with a trek through the park with a personal guide - this can be taken at your own pace, you can swing through the trees or have a more sedate walk – it's up to you!



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Then it's time to visit spectacular waterfalls, which were one of the backdrops in the film *The Beach* (though it is no longer possible to swim here for safety reasons). You'll then spend the afternoon driving around, stopping for wildlife-spotting opportunities, your guide will keep a look out. You can also visit the top of the mountain which is used as a radar station for aircraft – make sure to take a jumper, it can get quite chilly up here!

Day 15 – Saturday

This morning, you will be taken to Bangkok airport where you will catch your flight home, you will get back to London Heathrow at approximately 7pm UK time (same day). *It is also possible to have the day relaxing and fly back a day later.*

This specially designed 15-day itinerary costs from £1,900 per person based on two adults sharing a private tour. This includes international flights with Thai Airways or Eva Air, accommodation, activities, transport and meals except as listed below. Please allow money for local expenses such as entrance fees plus whatever you wish to spend on other items not included (see below). Based on our customer feedback a couple taking this 2 week tour spend somewhere between £300-400 overall (between the two of them).
